

adequate and accurate human and financial resources that can be provided to maximize efficiencies.

Town owned parks and sports fields that are to be sprayed are indicated in green on attached map.

STANDARDS:

Under normal weather conditions all areas of included in the weed control program will be sprayed by June 15th of each year for spring application or September 15th for fall application.

The weed control program will be carried out either by Recreational Parks Department staff or by contracted forces and will be at the discretion of the Director of Recreation and Parks; any person(s) carrying out this function and utilizing herbicide must have the required pesticide applicators certification.

Chemicals used for weed control that are acceptable must be approved by the Recreation and Parks Foreman.

Prior to handling chemicals the M.S.D.S. must be read, understood and precautions followed.

Weed control chemicals to be used will follow the Alberta Environment Standards and regulations this includes but does not limit the following:

- I. Weed control personnel must not let chemicals come in contact with any person(s), animal or domestic plant when the possibility exists, weed control operation must cease in that particular area.
- II. Weed control operations will cease in windy conditions.

PUBLIC COMMUNICATION:

Citizens are informed of all herbicide applications on property using signs, community bulletin boards, Town of Sylvan Lake website, and media.

Town of Sylvan Lake Recreation & Parks Department will place sandwich boards in each neighbourhood 1 day prior to the herbicide spraying, and the sandwich boards will include the anticipated day and time in which herbicide spraying will take place.

CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

The contractor must notify the Recreation and Parks Foreman when spraying will commence.

The contractor must be a licensed applicator (Industrial).

The contractor must provide The Town of Sylvan Lake with certification of insurance liability.

Water should be supplied by the contractor.

Must use a quad or all terrain vehicle except when spraying right of ways where a larger vehicle can be used. All spraying vehicles / equipment must be equipped with a sound emitting device that will function while herbicide spraying is taking place.

Contractor must have a current business license with the Town of Sylvan Lake.
